Why Should the Quran be a Must-Read Book - Non-theological Reasons


Pursuit of knowledge is an imperative for the humans. It distinguishes us from the ignorant class. Books are important vehicles in their journey through learning. During the early part of out learning curve, books are chosen for us by the parents and educational institutes. As we get matured, we often need to choose books based on our professional needs and passion. In so doing we often look for the international best-selling books and books of eminent scholars. This short article will explore as to why should the Quran be a must-read book for every human being from non-theological point of view while this is an irrelevant proposition from theological viewpoint. In so doing it will also highlight the uniqueness of the book. It may be noted with caution that the Holy Quran is the must-read book of true guidance for the whole of mankind, believers and nonbelievers alike on every aspect of their lives (14:52, 17:09) from theological perspective.

First and foremost, Quran is a multi-genre book while most others are uni-genre. It has reflections of every branch of knowledge the humans need to be successful; such as: science, astronomy, philosophy, psychology, sociology, history, mystery, art, culture, poetry, travelogue, leadership, management, business, warfare, strategy, grand strategy, inheritance, behavior, conduct, indications, life on earth, life after death and the list is inexhaustible.

This is the only book in which the author did not request anyone to write a preface for it. Conversely, He has repeatedly claimed the book to be a masterpiece, free from any error and doubt (2:2).

The author has challenged that all humans and Jinns together cannot produce a book like it and not even a chapter like that of the Quran (2:23. 10:38, 11:13, 17:88). Out of its 114 chapters, the author has praised His book at the opening of at least 24

chapters (2, 7, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 19, 20, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28,



The author has avowed to preserve His book unadulterated (15:09). This is one of the most widely read and published books in the world.



The book is being read and memorized by many people every day and night in some parts of the world. This is the only book which is completely memorized by people and there are millions of Hafizs (who memorize the entire Quran) in the world at any point in time. This is one of the highest printed books every year. Only King Fahd Complex of Madina prints over 10 million Qurans and associated books yearly for free dissemination across the world to every pilgrim.

This is the only book for which the author chose an unlettered (before his Prophethood) man for its marketing and propagation who eventually became the most influential man in the history of mankind (according to Michael H Hart) and who will remain so till the end of the world.

What more reasons the students of knowledge should be needing to select the Quran to be a must-read book for them. All the students of Manarat and all who will be reading this newsletter are earnestly requested to glance through the Quran and explore its uniqueness and satisfy your thirst for unique knowledge and wisdom.
